CELEBRATING SUCCESS AWARDS

These awards recognize successful club projects that improve the lives of women and girls, and that promote Soroptimist as an organization with that mission. These awards recognize the best practices of Soroptimist clubs in each of the four areas of SIA's strategic plan: fundraising, membership, program and public awareness.

In the past, the Region and Federation had their own awards, but, as announced at Spring Conference, there is a new process. Clubs will now apply only to the Region for the awards, the Region will choose the Region winners, and the Region winners will be submitted to SIA for Federation consideration. The new deadline is July 1, 2015.

THE "CLUB AWARD"

The "Club Award" no longer exists. This recognition award has been replaced with a new "Certificate of Appreciation" that will honor clubs that have met the below requirements:

1. Participate in SIA Programs (the Dream Programs);
2. Support SIA's Culture of Philanthropy (contribute 10% of funds raised locally to the Club Giving program; donate Founders Pennies); and
3. Grow Engagement with SIA (provide personal email addresses to SIA; submit Celebrating Success award applications; focus on recruiting new members and creating a happy and healthy club experience).

*** NOTE: Clubs do not apply for the award; clubs that meet the requirements will automatically receive the certificate.

VIOLET RICHARDSON AWARD AND THE RUBY AWARD

These programs are now only Club and Region-level awards/recognition programs.

The Region will be awarding the Violet Richardson Award (\$250 to the honoree and \$250 to her charity of choice) in 2015 and 2016. Club submissions are due by February 15, 2015, to the Region Chair (Cindy Swicegood, 307 Main St., Stevensville, MD 21666; cindyswicegood@yahoo.com).

The Region will no longer be awarding a monetary Ruby Award. Clubs that do continue the program should submit winner information to Governor Robin Davis so that the winners may be considered for workshops or presentations at Spring Conference.
